- To support effective expenditure under Policy Objective 2 of EU Cohesion Policy
- Experience shows need for tailored support to MS, regional and local authorities to implement climate and environmental investments with Cohesion Policy



Advice to the Estonian Islands' Energy Agency

- Beneficiary: Estonian Island Energy Agency
- Implementation period: October 2023 February 2024
- Focus area: Regional energy agenies
- Key scope and activities:
 - preparing LIFE application
 - developing concept for one-stop shop
 - identifying financing sources for projects (including ERDF/CF P02)
- Main outcomes:
 - Supported the establishment of the agency
 - Successful LIFE application





Advice to to Ihobe, the Basque Environment Agency

- Beneficiary: Ihobe (Basque Environment Agency)
- **Implementation period:** September 2023 October 2024
- Focus area: Climate change adaptation
- Key scope and activities:
 - Concept development for a study to assess the cost of inaction of climate change and prioritisation of climate adaptation projects
- Benchmarking of relevant climate-adaptation projects in comparable EU regions

Main outcomes:

- Successful launch of a study on the cost of inaction and identification and prioritisation of climate adaptation projects
- Four case studies on relevant European climate adaptation projects with recommendations on transferability and replication in the Basque Country







Improvement of the climateproofing procedures

- Beneficiary: REGEA North-West Croatia Regional Energy and Climate Agency
- Implementation period: January June 2024
- Focus area: Regional Energy agencies
- Key scope and activities:
 - Improving climate-proofing procedures on the level of strategic planning
 - Improving climate-proofing procedures on the level of infrastructure
 - Capacity-building workshop

Main outcomes:


- Set of action points for improvement Zagreb City Climate Adaptation Plan
- Guidelines for climate-proofing of investments improved on the basis of pilot investment "Paromlin" (urban regeneration project for the new city library and the cultural centre)



TA to the One-stop-shop for Residential Building Renovation in the Plovdiv Region

- Beneficiary: Energy Agency of Plovdiv
- Implementation period: October 2023 June 2024
- Focus area: Regional energy agencies
- Key scope and activities:
 - Establishing an overview of funding possibilities and pricing options for a one-stop-shop services
 - Capacity-building workshops
 - Outline of relevant financing options
- Main outcomes:
 - Provided funding possibilities and pricing options for a onestop-shop service.
 - Increased capacity of the Plovdiv EA personnel on building renovation.
 - Facilitated knowledge sharing and capacity building on the financing models for residential energy efficiency renovation.





Nature-based Solutions for Flood Management in Cyprus – Advice to the Cyprus Energy Agency

- Beneficiary: Cyprus Energy Agency
- Implementation period: January 2024 July 2024
- Focus area: Climate change adaptation
- Key scope and activities:
 - Development of a monitoring concept for the measures
 - Estimation of costs of the proposed measures
 - Advice on any further preparatory works (studies, etc.) needed to acquire funding
- Main outcomes:
 - Showed that measures would be cost-efficient and benefits will outweigh costs
 - Prepared elements and structure for a funding proposal





Advice to the Autonomous Region of Sardinia

- **Beneficiary:** The Regional Programming Centre (CRP) of the Autonomous Region of Sardinia
- Implementation period: April 2024 September 2024
- Focus area: Climate change adaptation
- Key scope and activities:
 - Climate Proofing exercise: climate data collection, involvement of relevant actors, analysis
 - · Regional Workshop on lessons learnt
 - Main outcomes:
 - Technical Report
 - Guidelines
 - Capacity building support






Advice to Valongo Municipality

- Beneficiary: Valongo Municipality
- Implementation period: March 2024 October 2024
- Focus area: Climate change adaptation
- Key scope and activities:
 - Priorities analysis addressing resilience of river systems
 - Developing concept note of bankable project (Climate adaptation and biodiversity)
 - Identification of best practices in river restoration and NbS
 - Identifying financing sources for projects (including under P02 and private-public partnerships)
- Main outcomes:
 - Improved Municipality capacity
 - Adaptable priority analysis
 - Concept note that can be adapted and reused in different contexts





TA to the Hungarian Ministry of Energy

- Beneficiary: Hungarian Ministry of Energy
- Implementation period: July 2024-Oct 2024
- Focus area: Circular economy
- Key scope and activities:
 - Identify and analyze calls of circular economy programmes relevant to HU.
 - Learn from call requirements of previous calls.

Main outcomes:

- Systematic mapping of call requirements of six selected CE calls, four selected Horizon calls, and two ERDF-financed funds.
- Key conclusions and take-aways.





TA to Eastern Macedonia, Thrace

- Beneficiary: Managing Authority eastern Macedonia Thrace
- Implementation period: May 2024 to October 2024
- Focus area: Sustainable water management
- Key scope and activities:
 - Written guidance on holistic water project preparation approach
 - Training Workshop
- Main outcomes:
 - Strengthen capacity projects projects in the drinking water sector
 - Resource developed for designing and evaluating projects holistic aproach
